



## AL'S SON OF LITTLE MAN S

Al's Son of Little Man S's was the most prolific son of Little Man S. Foaled April 20, 1960, the stallion Al's Son of Little Man S, was to become the patriarch of a well known Rangerbred breeding program years later. Al's Son of Little Man S, tattooed 5631250, was registered F3326 with the Appaloosa Horse Club, and would also be registered with the Colorado Ranger Horse Assn as 543-R. This stallion was described as dark bay, with a blanket and chestnut spots over the loin and hips, and a sock on the right hind leg. According to the ApHC records, his breeder was listed as George J. Bryant of Springfield, IL, and his owner was listed as A.L. Stump, of Troy OH. The first CRHA studbook lists A.L. Stump from Litchfield, OH, as an early owner of Rangerbred horses, Al Stump, who served as CRHA Secretary/Treasurer and on the Board of Directors during the early 1970's, was said to have been a large scale breeder, with 60-70 head of broodmares. Many of his mares came from Colorado, shipped by another early Rangerbred breeder, John Braddy, with his Four Jay Quarter Circle Appaloosa Ranch. Braddy, a Director of the CRHA during the early 1970's, shipped several shipments of mares to Stump for 6-7 years.

Al's Son of Little Man S, Stump's herd sire, featured on the cover of the June 1972 Hot-Line (predecessor of the Rangerbred News), is rich in both Appaloosa and Rangerbred ancestry. His sire is Little Man S ApHC F1789/CRHA 690-P; his dam is Bryant's Blue Lady F 3307. Little Man S was bred by W.C. (Pete) Smith (Know Your Director-Pete Smith of New Mexico, Appaloosa News August 1974, of Tatum, NM, and is twice descended from the K.K. Parson's program noted stallion (not CRHA) Rainy Moon F 181, through Coeur d'Alene F145 and Minnie Mouse F 1205. Bryant's Blue Lady was used in the G.J. Bryant program, known for Appaloosa stallions Cherokee Red Rex (Cherokee Red Rex-Pride of the Twin Brooks article in December 1966 Appaloosa News) and Cherokee Blue Rex. More details of the ancestry of Little Man S were provided in Part One

Little Man S sired the noted foundation stallion Bryant's Apache Lad F3552, as well as Bryant's Little Babe CRHA 1025, Little Misty Marvel CRHA 1049, Bear Swamp's Man Dee CRHA 1075, Little Rainy Man 45555, and others, as listed in part one of this series. Little Rainy Man, one of Little Man S's more prolific sons, went on to sire Bear Swamp's Rain Beau 144550 (also a grandson of Al's Little Man S), Bear Swamp Raindot 107128/CRHA 962), Bear Swamp Wite Night CRHA 960, Bear Swamp's Man Dee, Bear Swamp Rain Princess T112194/CRHA 961), and several others for Woodley's Bear Swamp program. The Woodley's Bear Swamp program predominantly used the stallion Assistant Chief of Bear Swamp 66983 (not CRHA), who did in fact sire CRHA National Champions, like Bear Swamp Twigggy (Jr trail, costume, halter, jr western pleasure, jr english pleasure)

Many of those breeders who propagated this family line helped CRHA and the Rangerbred to build and grow during the 1970's. Woodley, Braddy, Pipes, A.L. Stump, and Coultrip served on the Board of Directors and/or held official positions in CRHA. Alta Coultrip served as the Chairman of the Adult and Youth Show Program in the 1970's. Dr. Woodley won the "Most New Members" Award in 1978. Lyle and Alta Coultrip won the "Most Fools Registered" Award in 1978.



STUMPS DANDY

This family line has seen quite a bit of publicity throughout CRHA newsletters as well as some other CRHA promotional material, and Appaloosa publications. Stump's Doc was pictured in an advertisement for Vince and Corrine Rawlin's Cor-Vin Corral, in the August 1971 issue of the CRHA Hot-Line. Earl Gant advertised, with a photo of Stump's Hie Man, in the October/November 1974 Rangerbred News. Bear Swamp's Rain Beau and Stump's Guy, were both pictured in an advertisement in the aforementioned issue, by Dr. Woodley. Sonny's Diplomat was featured on the cover of the July/August/September 1976 issue of the Rangerbred News. Al's Son of Little Man S (April 1960-April 1972) was featured on the cover of the June 1972 Hot-Line. An Article in the July/August/September 1976 Rangerbred News detailed the Pipes having sold two of Sonny's Diplomat's foals to Australia—a major feat in those days. An article about the Rangerbred mare Pipe's Cher, appeared in the January/February/March 1975 Rangerbred News. Stump's Guy was featured on the cover of the January 1979 Rangerbred News. Stump's Guy was featured on the cover of the January 1979 Rangerbred News, having won the 5th CRHA National Performance Horse Award. Sonny's Diplomat was pictured as the Rangerbred representative in the Western Horseman's magazine 1974 'All Breed Issue' write up. In the 1970's the CRHA share-an-ad program in the Western Horseman magazines, Stump's Guy, Sonny's Diplomat, Bear Swamp's Rain Beau and Coultrips Boogieman advertisements could be found promoting the Rangerbred to the horse world. Stumps Guy, Kokomo Joe, Stump's Hie Man, Surprise Marquis, and Sonny's Diplomat participated in the CRHA Stallion Auction. An article about the Colorado Ranger Horse Assn, printed in the November 1978 Spotted Horse magazine, featured photos of Stump's Mecapo, Stump's Dandy, Stump's Guy, Pipe's Kokomo Joe, Bear Swamp's Majorette, Coultrip's Rusty Eagle, and Luke's Lady Windemere. Advertisements with pictures of Jeff Geiger's Kokomo Joe and Bear Swamp's Stump's Guy were also found in the November 1978 Spotted Horse. The 1973 Ohio Appaloosa Association Bulletin had an advertisement from Beaverwood Farms, selling Clark's Kiwa, a filly ut of Clark's Pow Wos, and a filly out of Clark's Kiwa. The 1985 Spring Summer and Winter Issues of the American Rangerbred carried a fully page advertisement, with photo, for Appa-A-Way Stable's Arco Prince. Stump-Haven Ranch had a full page advertisement with photo of Al's Son of Little Man S, said to have "sired over 325 registered Appaloosas", in the 1972 (25th) ApHC National Show Program. The 2006 September/October Rangerbred news carried an obituary notice for Sonny's Diplomat, who had to be put down in August 2006, at the age of 37 years. In the same obituary notice, Pipe's Angel, a daughter of Sonny's Diplomat had also been put down just 18 days prior.
